

SCOTLAND'S FUTURE NOW The debate about Scotland's future has not ended with the referendum. The Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland is once again hosting a nationwide discussion about the nation's future. The event in Glasgow will be linked by video with other venues across the country. There will be two leading speakers from the referendum campaigns, plus a neutral contribution. Rather than an open debate, the keynote speeches will be followed by discussion in groups. The Inverness event will take place at Crown Church on Wednesday 5th November, at 7pm (by kind permission of the Rev Peter Donald). It will be led by the Rev Peter W Nimmo of Old High St Stephen's, who is a member of the General Assembly's Church and Society Council.
