

- † Heavenly Father, this week we pray for our brothers and sisters in Malawi where 200,000 people have been displaced and 176 people have died due to severe flooding. This was mainly in the south but there are problems elsewhere across the country. This is a message received by Presbytery Clerk, "We are safe as of now here at Ekwendeni. There are some strong winds across Malawi which is affecting houses. These have had some effects to us. We are having a lot of power blackouts because electricity poles have been washed away in some places. We are using our standby generator which uses a lot of fuel and is draining our resources. The rains are still on we pray that it does not continue causing damages".
- Pray for the Church of Scotland HIV/AIDS programme currently supporting partner churches across the world in 29 different projects which include home-based care, to awareness raising and addressing stigma through education. Pray for the work of Waverley Care which helps people in our own country also supported by our church. Give praise for the advances against HIV being made in sub-Saharan Africa and pray that the spread of HIV will be contained in parts of Asia where the numbers continue to grow.
