PASTORAL DUTIES Up until 20th November Rev'd Russell Smith is available for pastoral cover and can be contacted on 861011.

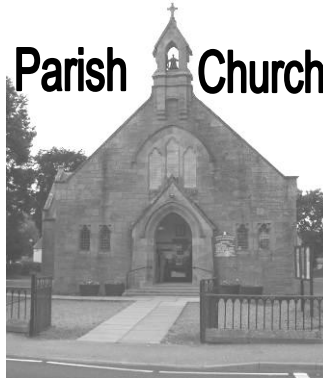
