

RECONSTRUCTION WORK IN NEPAL We have recently received a letter for Carol Finlay of the World Mission Council with regard to the money we raised through a retiring collection to assist with reconstruction following the 2015 earthquake in Nepal. The money, £300,000 altogether from the Church of Scotland, was sent to the United Mission to Nepal, a partner organisation of the Church, with the intention that it would be used to build safe, earthquake-proof houses for those whose homes had been destroyed. In the meantime the government of Nepal has decided that it will be responsible for all reconstruction of dwelling houses, through grants to affected householders and an inspection regime to ensure standards are adhered to. It has asked voluntary organisations such as the UMN to concentrate on public buildings such as schools, and infrastructure such as roads/trails, bridges and utilities. The UMN is asking the Church of Scotland's permission to use the donated money for such purposes, specifically to build 11 schools in addition to those it had originally pledged to build.
