<u>Please take this home with you to</u> help you with your prayers this week.

God's Spirit is on me; he's chosen me to preach the Message of good news to the poor, sent me to announce pardon to prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to set the burdened and battered free, to announce, "This is God's year to act!" Luke 4: 18-19 (The Message)

† Kingdom Prayer of Christian Aid: Holy God, in your kingdom the strong need the weak, the rich are transformed by the poor, the fortunate are welcomed by the homeless. Your kingdom is built by those who expect their God to come.

Pray for the people in Haiti, one of the poorest countries in the world, which was hit by an earthquake in 2010 and is still in recovery. Pray for people like Vilia and her seven children and give thanks for Christian Aid's partner KORAL who responded to her need and built her a new home where her neighbours were able to shelter when another hurricane hit.

- † Pray for the work of charities throughout the world such as Christian Aid. God knows their reputations have been brought into question by revelations in the press. God knows too that only a very small percentage of people worldwide have abused power. Pray for the many, many who try to carry out God's work under very difficult circumstances and that we will be generous with our plenty this week to help the poorest.
- † Job 31: 23 For I dreaded destruction from God, and for fear of his splendour I could not do such things.

What are the "such things" that Job lists as deserving God's judgement?— Denying the desires of the poor and letting the widow grow weary, keeping bread to himself and not sharing it with orphans, seeing someone die for lack of clothing, oppressing the fatherless and treating workers unfairly. Pray that we, like Job, might have a strong sense of having to answer to God for how we treat the poor and vulnerable.

† Remember the words of the old hymn, "Count Your Many Blessings, Name them one by one and it will surprise you what the Lord has done!" Try to carry this out this week when we are reminded of those less fortunate than ourselves.

One day..... Youngsters will learn words they will not understand. Children from India will ask: What is hunger? Children from Alabama will ask: What is racial segregation? Children from Hiroshima will ask: What is the atomic bomb? Children at school will ask: What is war?
