HIGHLAND SUPPORTS REFUGEES At a recent Session meeting, it was decided that over the summer we would collect toiletries for refugees still living in camps in Europe. There are many thousands of such, including families with children, and sick and disabled people, who came from Syria and many other war-torn countries two years or more ago and are still living in camps in Greece and other southern European countries, waiting for their asylum claims to be processed. Highlands Support Refugees collects a wide range of items at their Conon Bridge base in the old Ferintosh House (top of Sellar Place, next to the bowling club) to send out these people.. Items they have requested are; soap, shower gel, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrushes, razors, moisturisers, baby wipes, nappies, "adult nappies", sanitary towels. Please place any donations in the crates which will be placed in the Church vestibule throughout July and August.

<u>HIGHLAND FOODBANK</u> Thank you once again for your amazing generosity in support of this charity. All the usual items are required each week. Why not add one or two non-perishable foods to your weekly shop to donate to families or individuals who do not know from where their next meal might come.
