RETIRING OFFERING SUNDAY 30<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER The Session has agreed that there will be a retiring offering on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> September (Harvest Thanksgiving) for emergency relief and eventual reconstruction in the South West and North West Provinces of the Republic of Cameroon, where political tensions have led to a state akin to civil war, with destruction of homes and livelihoods, injury and in some cases death. This is the area where Janet Winchester worked in the 1970s and 80s, and the work will be led by the local Churches, including the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon, with which she worked.
