Thank you for happy things which came to me quite unexpectedly; for things which turned out to be not nearly so bad as I expected; for difficult things which became quite manageable when I faced up to them. Forgive me for the things I did not do, for the letter or email which is still not answered; for the promise which is still not kept; for the decision which is still delayed; for the habit which is still not given up. Make me honest enough to see myself as I am, and humble enough to seek from you the help I need, so that what I cannot do, your grace may do for me.
