Prayers for the Armed Forces

The famous WW1 Padre, William Studdert Kennedy MC, exhorted Junior Chaplains to make sure that, among other things, they 'prayed with their men some of the time but for them all of the time.' Studdert Kennedy understood the centrality and importance of prayer in ministry to the Armed Forces. That has not changed. Sailors, soldiers and airmen repeatedly and often talk of the benefit they feel knowing that they are being prayed for. Members of the Armed Forces today may not always be prayed with, but they will always be prayed for.

*Pray for those preparing for deployment, for wisdom in how they prepare practically and mentally. Pray that both the deployed and the ones staying at home would communicate honestly and openly about expectations. Pray for safety for those on operational deployments, that they would know the presence of Jesus with them in times of stress and danger. Thank God for the opportunities, challenges and changes for good that deployment can bring.

- * Pray for all the military medical staff, for them to be able to apply wisdom to their knowledge, for them to provide the best care they can for those sick and wounded. Pray that God would use the medical staff to heal the minds and bodies of our forces. Pray for the civilian and NHS staff who work with the Defence Medical Services, thank the Lord for their support and pray for their strength and wisdom,. Thank God, our Saviour and Healer.
- * Pray for any injured military personnel— for physical and, emotional and mental healing. Pray that they would turn to God in their time of need, that their time out of action would be a time of seeking God, whether for the first time or the hundredth. Pray for those injured unable to return to their former duties, that they may find new challenges and effective employment. Thank God for his provision of medical staff who are equipped to deal with injuries and their effects.
- * Pray for God to step in as Comforter and Prince of Peace into grieving families' lives. Pray that these families would be supported practically and would seek God in their pain. Pray for the Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre and Visiting Officers as they organise the initial casualty notification, for sensitivity as they break the news and for them to be able to offer good support. Thank God for the great work of charities in walking through bereavement with military families. *Pray for our ex-service personnel who are adjusting to different levels of income and outgoings. Pray for wisdom and that pride wouldn't prevent them from seeking advice. Pray for the role of the Church in helping those in financial difficulty, that we would be Christ-like in seeking to help those in need. Pray for the homeless that they will find shelter, help and support. Thank God for the charitable organisations who help those struggling with debt.
- *Pray for all those in command, from the King as Head of State to the most junior non-commissioned officer; that they may each 'do the right thing' and make Godly, wise and just decisions. Remember especially those deployed on operations, particularly those in command of men and women who are in harm's way. Thank God for the focus on leadership given to those in the Armed Forces.
